The MNO Grand River Métis Council through council resolution appointed me as the electoral officer to supervise council's November 9, 2019 election to ensure a fair election consistent with the *MNO Grand River Métis Council Community Electoral Code*. I was responsible to conduct, oversee and be responsible for all matters concerning the election of the community council, to ensure a fair and impartial election process and take any steps necessary to ensure the effective implementation of the *MNO Grand River Métis Council Community Electoral Code*.

As per Article B33.1 of the *MNO Grand River Métis Council Community Electoral Code* it is my duty to officially announce the results of the MNO Grand River Métis Council elections and declare elected those candidates who received the largest number of votes.

After the Close of Nominations on October 18, 2019 there were a total of 12 nominees for the 10 positions available on the MNO Grand River Métis Council, 11 nominees were verified with 1 nominee with an incomplete file and 1 nominee who withdrew her nomination. All 10 positions on council are considered acclaimed.
