ASSISTED HOME OWNERSHIP PROGRAM

A forgivable loan opportunity providing up to \$30,000 to assist individuals and families in the purchase of an Off-Reserve home in Ontario (outside of the GTA). Applicants should be low to moderate income, qualify for a mortgage and may not own real estate. Priority applicants include people escaping situations of violence and living in Social Housing.

HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

A forgivable loan opportunity providing up to \$25,000 to assist low to moderate income homeowners to repair their Off-Reserve homes. Applicants are reviewed in order of receipt. Priority will be given to homes with emergency repair such as health and safety concerns, accessibility repairs, energy efficiency upgrades and those below the poverty level.
