Welcome to the Métis Nation of Ontario's *Educator's Kit* for K-12 educators! Thank you for taking the necessary steps to include Métis educational perspectives and voices in your classroom! We recognize that this may be new learning for many educators. Our goal is to provide a series of resources that support educators and learners as they explore and learn about the Métis Nation and its people, history, culture, and language.

These resources are a simple-to-use tool for teachers and students. Educators can use their content to bring authentic Métis voices into the classroom. The resources allow students and educators to use the Métis experience to connect with a broad array of academic topics. Some are subject-specific, such as the Grade 10 Civics & Citizenship Guide, which examines Métis governance structures. Other contents of the education kit, such as the sash, are key pieces of Métis material culture that can be used in various ways within an educational setting.

Louis Riel Day is celebrated on November 16th every year. Sash	Both	One of the most prominent symbols of the Métis Nation is the brightly coloured, woven sash. In the days of the voyageur, the sash was both a colourful and festive item of clothing and a vital tool worn by the hardy tradesmen. Doubling as a rope when needed, the sash served as a key holder, first aid kit, washcloth, towel, and as an emergency bridle and saddle blanket. Its fringed ends could become a sewing kit when the Métis were on the land. The art of sash weaving was brought to the western regions of Canada by Voyageurs who encountered the bright 'scarves' through contact with French Canadians.

The book provides a unique and engaging portrayal of Métis heritage, featuring elements such as traditional dress, customs, and the iconic voyageur lifestyle. Key Connections: Historical Exploration, Voyageurs, Adventure Stories, Canadian History, Cultural Traditions, Historical Roles Learning Through Stories, Character Development, Map Reading, Teamwork, Heritage, Cultural Immersion, and Storytelling.
