ELECTION DATES: November 3, 2025 to November 5, 2025

Consistent with the Métis Nation of Ontario (MNO)
Community Charter agreement, By-laws and Community
Council Electoral Code, an election has been called for all
positions on the Superior North Shore Métis Council for a
three (3) year term.

- All registered Métis citizens, 16 and over, who live within the council boundaries are encouraged to participate in this election as a candidate or by exercising their right to vote.
- All citizens can vote for the Senator position.
- Only Métis Youth aged 16-29 can vote for the Youth Rep.
- All Métis Women who have identified as a woman with Registry can vote for the Women's Rep.

If you are interested in putting your name forward for one of the volunteer council positions, a nomination form has been included with this notice.

NINE (9) POSITIONS ON THE COUNCIL INCLUDE:

- PRESIDENT
- CHAIR
- SECRETARY-TREASURER
- SENATOR
- WOMEN'S REPRESENTATIVE
- YOUTH REPRESENTATIVE
- COUNCILOR-AT-LARGE (3 positions)

There is no in-person ballot-box voting. Voting will be done online or over the phone. Instructions on registering and voting are provided in this package and online.



From November 3, 2025, at 1:00 PM through to November 5, 2025, closing at 8:00 PM LOCAL TIME.

To vote online, you need to visit the above website and activate your account. On the first election day, as the polls open, a unique voter PIN will be emailed to you. You will need your PIN to vote. You can also activate your voter account and vote by phone (see telephone voting).

All times in this notice are Eastern Time.



November 3, 2025 OR November 5, 2025 Between 4:00 PM – 8:00 PM LOCAL TIME.

If you have no internet access or are having difficulties with your PIN or voting online, we have arranged support for you to vote verbally, on the phone, with a Returning Officer. Please call the toll-free number 1-855-923-3006 and follow the prompts. If you get an answering machine, please leave a clear message with your name, area code, and phone number, and a Returning Officer will return your call.



HOW TO RUN FOR A POSITION ON THE COMMUNITY COUNCIL:

- · Citizens must have a complete MNO Registry file.
- Community Council citizens can be nominated for one Council position only.
- The requirement for signatures of at least three (3)
 eligible electors who support the nomination, as per
 Electoral Code Part B, article B7.2, has been reinstated.
- Complete both sides of the nomination form and submit it to the Electoral Officer **before** the close of the nomination deadline date and time.
- Your primary residence and address must be within the council boundaries (provided on the right column).
- For verification, the MNO Registry requires an updated proof of address identification document (i.e. Valid Ontario Driver's license), that can be submitted with your nomination form. For more information on other acceptable ID please contact the MNO Registry at 1-855-798-1006.

OPENING OF NOMINATIONS:

September 22, 2025 at 9:00 AM (ET)

Both pages of the nomination form must be legible, fully completed and signed. Nomination forms can be scanned or photographed and emailed to the Electoral Officer. Nomination forms can also be submitted by mail, but must be received by the deadline date and time indicated below.

CLOSE OF NOMINATIONS DEADLINE:

October 14, 2025 at 6:00 PM (ET)

The Electoral Officer must receive all nomination forms by the above date and time. Incomplete nomination forms or late arrivals will not be accepted. A nomination form is enclosed or you can download a copy from the MNO's website on the Community Councils Elections page.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF OFFICIAL CANDIDATES:

October 17, 2025 at 4:00 PM (ET)

After the Close of Nominations, the Electoral Officer will ask the MNO Registrar to verify the nominee's file, proof of address, and eligibility to hold office. The verification process takes up to three (3) business days. Those candidates who do not meet the verification requirements will not be eligible to participate. Additional time for Registry verifications may result in slight delays in posting the official candidates list. If all candidates are acclaimed and the council has met quorum, there will be no online voting, and the official results will be posted.

MÉTIS COUNCIL BOUNDARIES:

Northern Boundary:

Beginning on the east shore of Orient Bay (88°8'15"W 49°22'27"N) travel in a straight line eastward until you reach Hwy 11 (88°8'11"W 49°22'26"N). Next travel in a straight line east until you come to the northern point of Manitouwadge Lake (85°47'41"W 49°8'42"N).

Eastern Boundary:

Beginning at the northern point of Manitouwadge Lake (85°47'41"W 49°8'42"N), follow a straight line in a south east direction until you come to the north shore of Shabotik Bay, west of White Lake Peatlands Provincial Park (85°36'W 48°51'36"N). Continue along the north shore of Shabotik Bay in an east and then southerly direction, crossing over Hwy 17 (85°37'31"W 48°43'16"N). Continue in a southerly and then westerly direction along the east shore of White River, until you come to the mouth of the White River at the shoreline of Lake Superior (86°16'5"W 48°32'45"N).

Southern Boundary:

Beginning at the mouth of the White River at the shoreline of Lake Superior (86°16'5"W 48°32'45"N), travel in a straight line in a westerly direction until you come to the southern point of Puff Island (88°3'55"W 48°38'54"N).

Western Boundary:

Beginning at the southern point of Puff Island (88°3'55"W 48°38'54"N) follow the shoreline of Puff Island in a northern direction to a point on the southwest shore of Puff Island (88°3'50"W 48°39'8"N). Continue to travel in a straight line, in a northerly direction, until you reach the eastern shoreline of Fluor Island (88°3'27"W 48°40'41"N). Continue along the shoreline of Fluor Island in a northerly direction until you reach Beeton Point on the north end of Fluor Island (88°5'9"W 48°42'7"N). Continue in a straight line in a north westerly direction until you reach the west shoreline of the Nipigon Strait (88°5'43"W 48°42'45"N). Continue along the western shoreline of the Nipigon Strait in a northerly and then westerly direction to a point along the shoreline at the mouth of the Nipigon Strait (88°7'45"W 48°47'56"N). Continue in a straight line in a northwesterly direction, passing Burnt Island, until you reach the northern shore of Nipigon Bay (88°12'40"W 48°57'56"N). Continue along the shoreline in a westerly direction until you come to the mouth of the Nipigon River. Continue along the eastern shoreline of Nipigon River until you reach the bridge at Hwy 11 (88°15'W 49°1'11"N). Continue northerly along the shoreline of Helen Lake until you come to a point along the north east shoreline of Helen Lake close to Hwy 11 (88°16'23"W 49°6'37"N). Continue in a straight line in an easterly direction until you reach Hwy 11 (88°16'18"W 49°6'36"N). Continue along Hwy 11 in a northerly direction until you come to a point on Hwy 11 near the east shore of Orient Bay (88°6'22"W 49°18'34"N). Go westward until you reach the east shoreline of Orient Bay (88°6'23"W 49°18'35"N) Continue northward along the east shore of Orient Bay until you reach the shoreline directly west of Hwy 11 (88°8'15"W 49°22'27"N)
