WHAT WE DO

As the Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC) Programs & Services team, we are committed to supporting Métis children aged 0-12 and their families through a holistic range of early learning programs, services, and resources. Early childhood education lays the foundation for lifelong learning, and we strive to ensure Métis children get a strong start and grow into resilient learners. We deliver programs that provide direct financial support to families, helping more Métis children access healthy, culturally grounded education. We also develop foundational early learning documents, regulations, pedagogy, and curriculum.

ELCC FAMILY SUPPORTS

Our Family Supports Programs consist of several distinct programs: The Child Care Subsidy Program provides Métis families with financial support to access quality child care; the Child Care Stipend Program provides support for alternative child care when licensed child care is not an option; the Extra-Curricular Support Program fosters Métis children's social, emotional, and physical wellbeing; and the Summer Child Care Subsidy Program provides access to summer camp programming for school-aged children. Together, these programs provide support and make education more accessible to over 2500 children across Ontario.

DEVELOPMENTAL RESOURCE CONSULTANT (DRC) SUPPORTS

Our Developmental Resource Consultant (DRC) Program provides support to Métis children aged 0-8 years by offering advocacy and navigation services so families can identify learning barriers and access support. Additionally, the DRC team offers parent engagement workshops and support groups focused on child development. Sessions include supporting children with Autism, learning disabilities, and developmental delays. If a child requires further assessment or intervention, they can be referred to the Developmental Services and Support Program (DSSP). This program addresses the needs of Métis children and improves access to clinical services and early intervention supports in homes, childcare settings, and schools.

ELCC SPECIAL PROJECTS

Our Special Projects team oversees the development of early years books, resources, and Métis-based learning kits that connect to play-based learning. This work includes overseeing the Christmas Program, Baby Bundle Program, and Back-to-School Backpack Program, which all provide Métis families and educators with unique learning resources. The Special Projects team is also a community partner of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, which provides children (ages 0-5) with free books. Key to their work, the Special Projects team also hosts virtual and in-person events, including Camp AGA, in-person and virtual camps, and Rendezvous. Notably, the team hosts an annual professional Early Learning & Child Care conference where educators working in the sector can connect and learn about Métis ways of knowing and how to incorporate this knowledge into their learning environments.

- ∞ The Métis Tales Working Group—a group of staff across multiple ELCC teams who are content experts in child development and phonetic awareness—developed several series of age-appropriate Métis-specific books, including the **Christmas Book** series and the **Real-Life Métis Superhero** series.
- ∞ ELCC Programs & Services events, programs, series, and various supports became available on the **MNO Education Hub** mobile app—a virtual Indigenous education centre for MNO citizens, educators, families, and students.

ABOUT EDUCATION & TRAINING

The MNO began to offer training initiatives in 1996 with funding from the Métis Human Resources Development Agreement. Since then, the Education and Training Branch has grown and developed to include a comprehensive infrastructure that delivers a full range of programs. It supports the educational success of all Métis across Ontario, beginning in early learning, continuing through kindergarten to grade twelve, into adulthood through post-secondary education, and then into employment. We also work to retain and revitalize our languages, honour our culture and way of life, and provide ongoing learning outside formal education structures.

We take pride in our culture and history, recognize and honour the Métis knowledge holders and senators who contribute to our way of life, teaching and learning opportunities, and take pride in our Métis languages. We look forward to sharing our traditions with future generations as we aspire to achieve our highest potential.

Dark Blue: Métis inclusion in all learning environments
