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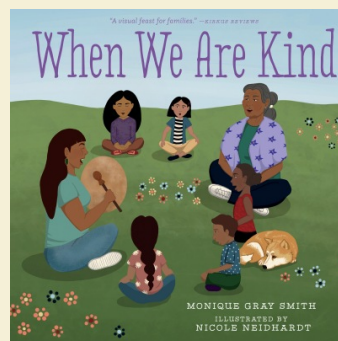

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Wednesday, February 25, is Pink Shirt Day!

Read *When You Are Kind* by Monique Gray Smith with the children in your learning environment to explore the importance of everyday kindness. This story highlights meaningful but straightforward moments that inspire children to notice, celebrate, and practice kindness in their daily lives. As you read together, encourage children to reflect on how it feels to offer kindness and to receive it, helping them build empathy, confidence, and emotional awareness.

After reading, invite children to share examples of kind actions they have experienced or offered to others. You might also support this learning through dramatic play, collaborative art experiences, or kindness challenges that promote cooperation and connection. These hands-on opportunities help children understand that kindness strengthens relationships and builds a caring classroom community.
