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## Loose Parts in the Winter!

Educators and children love the open-ended nature of loose parts. Children and materials found in nature have a reciprocal relationship that can act as an essential connection to place and ecology.

### Items needed:

- Snowy surfaces such as the ground, hill, or sidewalk.
- Natural items found in nature.

### Nature items to collect:

- Small rocks
- Leaves
- Twigs
- Feathers
- Pinecones
- Icicles
- Nuts/seeds
- Tree bark
- Small toys



### How to do this activity:

1. During outdoor play, encourage children to collect their own assortment of natural loose parts items with an outdoor scavenger hunt around your outdoor space.
2. Once children have collected the materials from nature, invite them to explore their materials freely and openly. Encourage children to explore new materials to create patterns, animate creatures, and build, and use their imagination to tell stories on snow or a surface.
